## CALL FOR TUTORIALS

CAiSE'18 invites proposals for tutorials in **challenging issues** on Information Systems engineering. These tutorials will be 90 minutes long and should aim at offering new insights, knowledge, and skills to managers, teachers, researchers, and students seeking to **gain a better understanding of the state-of-the-art in Information Systems engineering**. They are a good way to get a broad overview of a topic beyond a current paper presentation. The proposals emphasizing on the CAiSE'18 theme 'Information Systems in The Big Data Era' and highlighting the links and/or the impacts of the new challenges with/on the fundamentals of Information Systems Engineering are particularly encouraged.

Tutorials are intended to provide unbiased instruction on a topic of relevance to the conference. Therefore, no commercial or sales-oriented presentations will be accepted. Potential presenters should keep in mind that there may be quite a varied audience, including novice graduate students, seasoned practitioners, and specialized researchers. Tutorial speakers should be prepared to cope with this diversity. Tutorials will be organized in parallel with the technical sessions of the main conference and participants of the conference will have free access to all them.

Tutorial proposals should be sent by email to [caise2018tutorials@lists.ut.ee](mailto:caise2018tutorials@lists.ut.ee). Prior contact with the tutorial chairs (using the same email address) is encouraged. Each tutorial proposal will be evaluated on its anticipated benefit for prospective participants and its fit within the tutorial program as a whole. Other factors to be considered include: relevance to practice and to research, timeliness, importance, and audience appeal; effectiveness of teaching methods; and past experience and qualifications of the instructors.

## Detailed Instructions for Tutorial Proposers

The proposal (length up to 1500 words) should cover the following points:

- Title
- Presenters and affiliation
- Goal and Objectives: The overall goal of the tutorial and the concrete objectives to be achieved.
- Scope: Intended audience, level (basic or advanced), and prerequisites.
- Topic relevance and novelty: Specifically indicate the relevance to the scope of CAiSE, the relevance to practice, the novel aspects that would make this tutorial beneficiary and appealing to CAiSE participants.
- Teaching Method: The teaching method(s) that you will use in your tutorial. Please specify the technology requirements for presentation (overhead transparency projector, pc projector, etc.).
- Structure of Contents: Here you should provide a structured overview of your planned tutorial, organized into numbered sections and sub-sections. For each sub-section, you should sketch its contents in a few sentences or bullets.
- References: Provide references to papers, books, etc. your tutorial builds on. Please specify previous venues at which similar tutorials have been presented by you and indicate the difference between the proposed tutorial and previous ones. CAiSE will not accept tutorials that have been presented in other venues.
- Sample Slides: Prepare 3 sample slides from the presentation that you would give if your tutorial were accepted. Select slides that are typical for your presentation style. These slides have to be submitted in a separate PDF file.

- 23d February 2018: Notification of tutorial acceptance
- 23d March 2018: Camera-ready tutorial abstract submission
- 13-15th June 2018: Tutorials during CAiSE conference
